

How to Grow Achillea



Position – Full sun

Soil – Well-drained

Flowering Period- Summer and autumn

Hardiness – Fully hardy

Where to plant Achillea



Achillea are best planted in a well-drained soil of loam, chalk and sand within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best planted in an area that receives full sun. Achillea are well suited to being planted in beds and borders within cottage or informal garden settings and also make good cut flowers.

How to plant Achillea



Achillea are best planted in the spring- use a garden fork to tease and loosen the soil, digging around 30-38cm (12-15in) deep. Apply a layer of compost and mix in well, spacing your plants around 30cm (12in) apart. Water thoroughly once in place to settle the soil.

How to care for Achillea



In spring, apply a layer of mulch and a thin layer of compost. Keep your plants watered regularly if there has not been much rainfall. Deadhead the flowers to extend the flowering period for the following season. In autumn, cut to ground level unless you wish to leave flower heads over the winter to create interest.

How to propagate Achillea



It is possible to propagate Achillea by division during the spring.
