

How to Grow Asphodeline



Position – Full sun

Soil – Well-drained

Flowering Period – Spring

Hardiness – Hardy

Where to plant Asphodeline



Asphodeline are best planted in a well-drained soil of chalk, loam or sand within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area that receives full sun. Asphodeline are well suited to being planted in flower beds and borders and on banks and slopes.

How to plant Asphodeline



Dig a hole wide and deep enough to accommodate the size of your plant. You may wish to amend the soil with a generous amount of organic matter and mix thoroughly. Water well once in place to settle the surrounding soil.

How to care for Asphodeline



Asphodeline may require additional protection during cold spells over the winter period. Apply a generous layer of mulch around the base of your plant in autumn. You may wish to cut back after flowering although the seed heads are an often attractive visual during the colder months.

How to propagate Asphodeline



It is possible to propagate Asphodeline by seed or by division once flowering has finished.
