

How to Grow Bergenia



Position – Sun or part shade

Soil – Moist but well-drained

Flowering Period – Spring

Hardiness – Fully hardy

Where to plant Bergenia



Bergenia are best planted in a moist but well-drained soil of sand, clay, chalk or loam within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area of sun or part shade. Bergenia are well suited to banks, slopes, flower beds and borders within cottage and informal garden settings.

How to plant Bergenia



You may wish to amend the soil with a generous layer of compost to enhance the nutritional value of the planting area. They should be placed at a depth that matches the root ball and 30cm (12in) apart from companion plants.

How to care for Bergenia



During early winter, apply a generous layer of compost to the base of your plants. Protect from colder conditions by adding a dry mulch consisting of straw or chopped leaves to protect your plant from repetitive freezing and thawing. Tidy your plant during winter by removing old, dead or diseased foliage and trim back to a desirable shape.

How to propagate Bergenia



It is possible to propagate Bergenia by division in autumn or spring.
