

How to Grow Brunnera



Position – Part shade

Soil – Moist but well-drained

Flowering Period – Spring

Hardiness – Fully hardy

Where to plant Brunnera



Brunnera are best planted in a well-drained soil of loam, sand, chalk or clay within an acidic or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area of part shade. Avoid areas where it gets hot afternoon sun as the leaves may burn. Brunnera are well suited to beds and borders within a cottage or informal garden style.

How to plant Brunnera



You may wish to amend the planting area with compost to enrich and loosen the soil. Water well after planting and apply a mulch to help keep them moist and cool.

How to care for Brunnera



Water your Brunnera plants well to maintain moisture and provide a good drainage so that your plants are not sat in soggy soil. In autumn remove old foliage and flowers. Apply a mulch of well-rotted manure or garden compost around the base of the plant in spring.

How to propagate Brunnera



It is possible to propagate Brunnera by division in early spring or autumn.
