

How to Grow Fuchsia



Position – Full sun or part shade

Soil – Well-drained

Flowering Period – Early summer to autumn

Hardiness – Tender to Hardy (depending on variety)

Where to plant Fuchsia



Fuchsia are best planted in a well-drained soil of sand, clay, chalk or loam within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area of full sun or part shade. Fuchsia are well suited to flower beds and borders within city, courtyard, cottage and informal garden settings. They also make fantastic container and basket plants.

How to plant Fuchsia



It is recommended that tender varieties be planted in containers or baskets where they can easily be removed to a warmer environment when the first sign of frost sets in. Dig a hole as deep and wide as the root ball and water thoroughly and deeply to settle into place.

How to care for Fuchsia



Water regularly during warmer weather, taking care not to overwater as this may rot the roots. Fertilise every fortnight, although this should be limited towards the end of summer as your plants start to prepare to slow down for the winter. When the weather becomes colder, remove your plants and store them indoors in an environment such as a porch or conservatory.

How to propagate Fuchsia



It is possible to propagate Fuchsia by softwood cuttings or semi-hardwood cuttings.
