



How to Grow Liriope

Position – Part shade and full shade

Soil – Moist, well-drained

Flowering Period – Autumn

Hardiness – Fully hardy

About Liriope

Liriope are evergreen herbaceous perennial plants that form compact clumps of linear, grass-like foliage and dense spikes of bluish-purple flowers, followed by black berries. Liriope are best suited to flower beds and borders or used as underplanting for shrubs, within a courtyard, cottage and informal garden. You should expect to see your plants grow to an approximate height and spread of 10-50cm (4-20").

How to plant Liriope

Liriope are best planted in moist, well-drained soil of sand, loam and clay within an acidic or neutral PH balance. Enrich the planting area with a generous amount of compost. Plant your Liriope to the same depth and width as the root ball and water thoroughly to settle the soil into place. Site your plants in an area that will attract part shade or full shade.

How to care for Liriope

Liriope do not require much moisture once established. Water once after planting and only occasionally if the soil is dry.

How to propagate Liriope

It is possible to propagate Liriope by seed sown in containers during spring. Alternatively, you may wish to propagate by division during spring.
