

How to Grow Osteospermum



Aspect: Sun or part shade

Flowering: May to October

Hardiness: Half hardy

Soil: Well-drained

Where to plant Osteospermum



Osteospermum are best planted in a well-drained soil of chalk or sand within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area of full sun but will tolerate part shade if necessary. They look best in flower beds and borders within courtyard, informal and cottage garden settings, or in containers or pots.

How to plant Osteospermum



Make sure you water these plants deeply and thoroughly at the time of planting and continue to do so whilst they are young, taking care not to waterlog the soil.

How to care for Osteospermum



Water regularly to prevent plants from drying out, taking care not to overwater the soil as this will cause detriment to the root system. For your plants to thrive, you may wish to feed on a weekly basis with a general fertiliser as this will promote flowering. It is possible to deadhead wilted flower as this will prolong flowering and will neaten your plant when it has finished blooming. Provide your plants with winter protection as they are not hardy.

How to propagate Osteospermum



It is possible to propagate Osteospermum by softwood cuttings during late spring or semi-hardwood cuttings during late summer.
