

How to Grow Petrorhagia



Aspect: Full sun

Flowering: Summer

Hardiness: Hardy

Soil: Well-drained

Where to plant Petrorhagia



Petrorhagia are best planted in a well-drained soil of chalk, clay, loam or sand within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area of full sun. They are well suited to a cottage garden, rock garden or planted in containers.

How to plant Petrorhagia



Plant in a well-drained soil. Amend the soil if necessary, to improve drainage.

How to care for Petrorhagia



After flowering stops, plants may be cut back to encourage a second flowering. Drought tolerant once established.

How to propagate Petrorhagia



It is possible to propagate Petrorhagia by seed or stem tip cuttings.
