

How to Grow Xerochrysum



Position – Full sun

Soil – Well-drained

Flowering Period – Summer to autumn

Hardiness – Annual

Where to plant Xerochrysum



Xerochrysum are best planted in a well-drained, loam-based soil within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area that receives full sun. Growing them in full sun rather than partial shade will prevent the stems from flopping. Xerochrysum are well suited to growing in containers and borders as well as for a cutting garden as they make excellent cut and dried flowers.

How to plant Xerochrysum



Plant when the risk of frost has passed as these plants need to be kept frost free. Soil may need to be amended with compost or grit to ensure good drainage. Water after planting.

How to care for Xerochrysum



Deadhead regularly to encourage more flowers. Cut back after flowering. Plants should be kept frost free as they are not hardy.

How to propagate Xerochrysum



It is possible to propagate Xerochrysum easily by seed sown in the spring.
