

How to Grow Aconitum



Position – Sun or part shade

Soil – Fertile, moist but well-drained

Flowering Period- Summer or autumn

Hardiness – Fully hardy

Where to plant Aconitum



Aconitum are best planted in a fertile, moist but well-drained soil of loam or clay within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in a position of sun or part shade where they are protected from intense mid-summer heat. Aconitum are well suited to being planted in borders within a cottage or informal garden setting.

How to plant Aconitum



Soil may need to be amended with compost before planting. For improved health and development, plant your Aconitum with a generous layer of mulch to retain moisture levels. Always take care when handling Aconitum as they are a highly toxic plant.

Always wear protective gloves when planting or transferring. Take extra caution with open wounds and do not ingest.

How to care for Aconitum



Aconitum may require staking if planted in an exposed site or during periods of adverse weather conditions. If grown in full sun, ensure your plant is watered on a regular basis as they do thrive best in cooler climates, taking extra caution during periods of drought. Prune in the autumn to ensure healthy regrowth for the following season.

How to propagate Aconitum



.It is possible to propagate Aconitum by division or seed during late autumn. Please take care whilst handling this plant and always wear gloves.
