

How to Grow Agastache



Position – Full sun

Soil – Moist but well-drained

Flowering Period- Summer and autumn

Hardiness – Tender to fully hardy (depending on variety)

Where to plant Agastache



Agastache are best planted in a moist but well-drained soil of sand, chalk or loam within an acidic, alkaline or neutral PH balance. They are drought tolerant plants and are best positioned in an area of full sun. Agastache are well suited to flower beds and borders within cottage, informal or wildlife garden settings where they will attract an abundance of bees and butterflies.

How to plant Agastache



You may wish to amend the planting area with plenty of organic matter, mixing thoroughly to improve overall drainage.

How to care for Agastache



Ensure that your plants have plenty of water whilst they are still young, reducing the volume of water as they mature. Agastache can produce a better stock of flowers when they are initially grown indoors from late April then transferred to beds and borders during early summer.

How to propagate Agastache



It is possible to propagate Agastache by seed or division in spring or by root semi-ripe cuttings in late summer and during winter if kept under cover in a greenhouse.
