

How to Grow Rhodohypoxis



Position – Full sun

Soil – Moist but well-drained

Flowering Period- Summer

Hardiness – Half Hardy

Where to plant Rhodohypoxis



Rhodohypoxis are best planted in a well-drained soil or loam or sand within an acidic or neutral PH balance. They are best positioned in an area that receives full sun. Rhodohypoxis are well suited to a gravel, container or rock garden.

How to plant Rhodohypoxis



Amend the planting area with plenty of compost to improve drainage. Dig a hole that fits the depth and width of the root ball and firm into place. Water thoroughly after planting to settle the soil into place.

How to care for Rhodohypoxis



Rhodohypoxis may require a light feed and the soil should be kept moist throughout the growing season. Do not water during winter as this will rot the roots. Apply a generous layer of mulch to the base of your plants to retain moisture levels and to suppress weeds.

How to propagate Rhodohypoxis



It is possible to propagate Rhodohypoxis by seed sown in pots as soon as ripe or by division in late autumn.
